Annex A Risk Assessment

Risk Categories

1) External: Potential risks related to socio-economic or political circumstances beyond the control of the implementing entity. For example: war or political instability, systemic gender discrimination, lack of infrastructure.

2) Financial: Potential risks related to funding, misuse/mismanagement of funds or fraud. For example, currency fluctuations which reduce the amount of funding available for the project in the local currency.

3) Operational: Potential risks related to the internal capacity of the implementing entity. For example, not having sufficient staff with the right skills to carry out the project.

4) Safety and Security: Potential risks related to the safety and security of the recipient or beneficiaries by implement this project. Example: privacy, protection of data and online security.

5) Timeframe: Potential risks related to delays in the implementation of the project affecting the achievement of outcomes. For example: COVID-19

**Likelihood Categories

High Likelihood: Risk is very probable/certain.

Medium Likelihood: There is a probable chance that the risk will manifest.

Low Likelihood: There is a remote to improbable chance that the risk will manifest
